At many schools, this tight-knit community and impactful results are uncommon, but at Nativity Worcester this is the norm. LEARNING, CONNECTING, AND EXCELLING DURING CHALLENGING TIMES

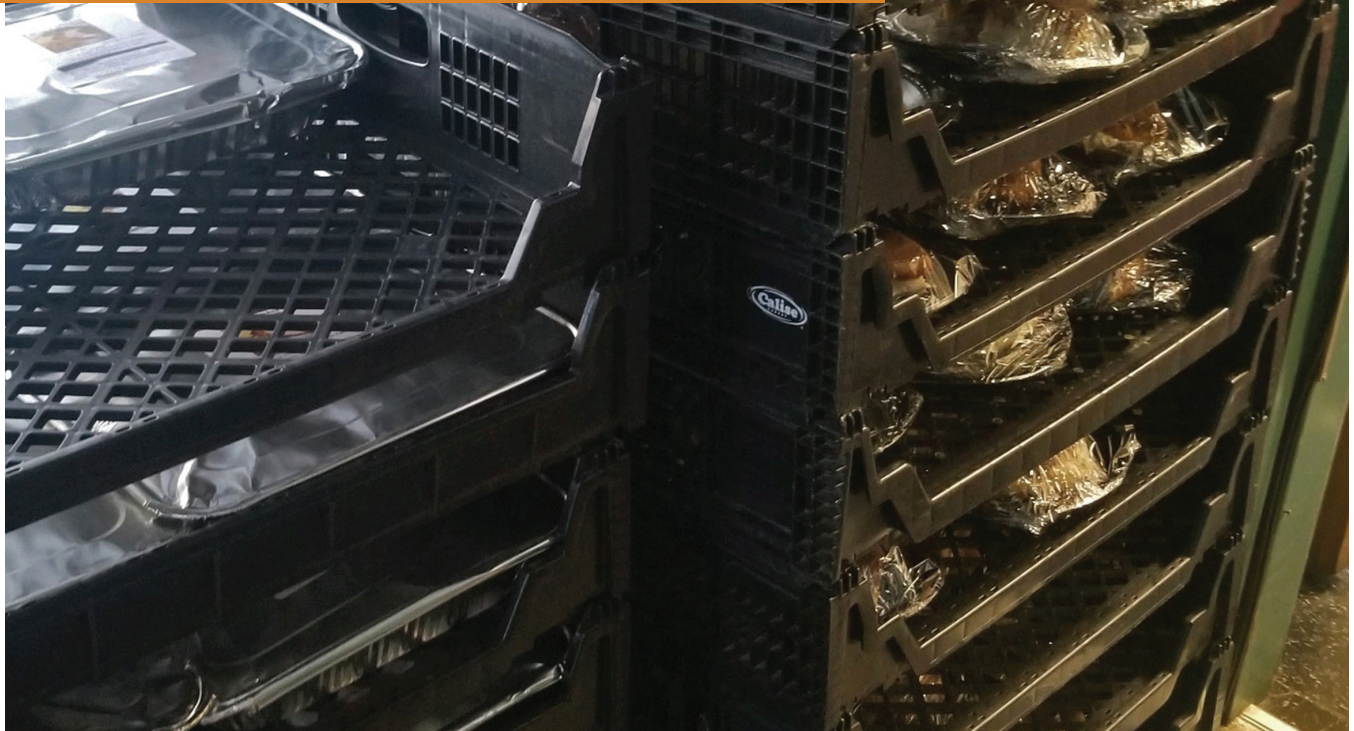


The pandemic required our community to adapt and persevere while learning remotely during the majority of the 2020-2021 school year. On May 6, 2021, we re-opened our doors for a full school return for the first time since March 2020. The excitement was shared by everyone, and it continued as we finished the school year. Being back in-person looked a lot different than it did before the pandemic for our community with new health and safety measures and restrictions in place. We shortened

our school day to help our students to a new way of learning and connecting with each other as our campus was virtual for adjust to in-person learning community-building workshops to provide space for reconnecting after 14 months of remote learning. During this unique time, our students, faculty and staff came together in ways we could not have imagined, leaning on each other to navigate this new world and drawing strength from the foundation of our Nativity community.

IMPACTING THE WHOLE FAMILY: PRIORITIZING FOOD SECURITY

Since the start of the pandemic, Nativity Worcester made the commitment to give all its families access to food during a time of uncertainty by establishing a food pantry. In 2020, we were packaging and providing weekly food bags to every current Nativity family (60), and an additional 15 bags for families of graduates who were in need of support. In late 2020 and into 2021, we made the shift to have families opt out of receiving this support if they no longer needed it. Since then, the food pantry continues to serve 25-30 families every other week, and has been able to provide families a gift card to help supplement our food resources for the weeks they were not receiving a food bag. Recent generous donations allowed us to improve our offerings and provide one perishable option for families to receive. The food pantry has had a tremendous impact on our families and improved food security has played a major role in ensuring our students thrive in the classroom.





YEAR END PILLAR AWARDS

On May 27, 2021, we held our annual year-end Pillar Awards at Institute Park, a local park where we could safely hold this special event and enjoy a picnic lunch together. The Pillar Awards recognize students who were selected by the school's faculty and staff that best reflect the four pillars—Strength (Vires), Character (Mores), Service (Christianitas), and Scholarship (Studium). Awards are given for three of the pillars to one student from the eighth grade, and one student from the fifth-, sixth-, or seventh-grade, while the final pillar award of scholarship is presented to one student from all four classes. The Spirit Award is awarded during the graduation ceremony to a member of the eighth grade class who has exemplified what it means to be a Nativity Man on countless occasions during his time at Nativity Worcester.

A NATIVITY EDUCATION — “A BIG TURNING POINT”

A Nativity Worcester education is a pivotal and impactful turning point for its students. The school strives to build a community and learning experience that enables its students to realize their potential, discover their interests, and build the skills to be leaders in a complex world. A core component of the Nativity Worcester experience is its mandatory summer session during the month of July with three weeks of classes, field trips, and a comprehensive service-learning program. The mornings begin with language arts and math classes, which help our students improve and excel in core academic subjects before the traditional school year begins. In the afternoons, students and faculty volunteer for local organizations related to the topics they are learning about in service-learning classes. The goal of the service-based learning is to engage students in projects that not only teach them valuable, curriculum-linked lessons, but also empower them to recognize the ways they can improve their community. This summer, our fifth through seventh graders worked on service projects and

initiatives for Notre Dame Long Term Care Center, Service to Self and Jafet Muzic, and Elevating Voices.

The eighth grade students had the opportunity to work with a Youth Philanthropy Initiative (YPI) and learn about philanthropy within nonprofit organizations. They reflect on their own personal values to determine which key social issue they deem most important to support in the Worcester community. Based on this determination, the students are given the opportunity to distribute \$5,000 of grant funds to local organizations. The YPI Program and Summer Session overall are unique and foundational opportunities for our students to develop their leadership and service skills.



BACK IN THE BUILDING

FALL 2021



The Nativity Men returned for the Fall semester on September 8th. Students had the opportunity to, once again, learn in-person within Nativity Worcester's small class sizes and extended school day, which allows for a rich, collaborative learning experience. Cross country and soccer teams returned for successful seasons along with the continuation of popular

clubs such as the Nativity Broadcasting Club (NBC), snacks from around the world, music, and arts clubs. The Nativity Worcester community was also thrilled to welcome back over 60 volunteers from the College of the Holy Cross, who provide one-on-one tutoring for students three evenings a week.



WELCOME, SWAMY, S.J. CLASS OF 2025

An important tradition at Nativity School of Worcester is to name each class after an outstanding Jesuit whose life serves as a beacon of hope, promise, and inspiration. The name of this Jesuit remains with the class throughout its four years here at Nativity Worcester and beyond. The life and contribution of this Jesuit gives the Nativity Men a unique and special way to understand and grow in the values of the four pillars that characterize a Nativity student: strength, scholarship, character, and service. This year the faculty and staff voted that the new fifth grade class, from this day on, be known as: The Swamy Class of 2025 named after Father Stan Swamy, S.J., who dedicated his life to the human family and to the building of God's kingdom of peace and justice.

GRADUATE SUPPORT PROGRAM



Nativity Worcester makes a 12 year commitment to its students. The Graduate Support Program effectively tracks, supports, and mentors students once they have graduated from Nativity Worcester, ensuring each student's success in high school and access to higher education. Staffed by the Vice President, Director of High School Placement and Support, Director of College Placement and Transition, and Associate Director of Advancement, the Graduate Support Program meets the growing and diverse needs of our graduates. We provide a safe and quiet space for homework help or schoolwork, high school transition and completion support, after-school and summer job search assistance, program events and community service opportunities, and college search and financial aid application support. The Joanne and Brian McClatchy Graduate Support Room is a dedicated space on campus that functions as a safe haven for program participants looking to use computers for research, receive tutoring, or work on school assignments in a space

conducive to learning. The Office of Graduate Support, generously donated in honor of Sister Cecilia Leonor Naxas, O.P., houses our Graduate Support staff and provides a meeting space for graduates and their families.

A GROWING IMPACT ON GRADUATES

Nancy's Fund was established in honor of Nancy Flaherty, wife of Joseph Flaherty, and a longtime supporter who passed away in 2017 to support Nativity Worcester graduates with scholarships for high school. This scholarship fund is critical and allows Nativity to truly fulfill its 12 year commitment to our Nativity Men—from middle school through post-secondary education. Through the generosity of many, this endowment fund has grown to over \$1,000,000 and serves as an incredibly impactful resource for Nativity Graduates allowing them to continue to receive an excellent education!

NETWORKING NIGHT

The Graduate Support Team hosted a virtual Networking Night on January 12, 2021. This annual event invites all Nativity Worcester graduates, and the current eighth grade class, to meet community members, Nativity graduates, and learn the various internship and job opportunities available to them. The evening had three components: a career fair, mock interviews, and workshops on personal branding, led by Guillermo Creamer '08 and budgeting, led by Bill Keville and PJ Lidonde '09.
