ELLACURIA CLASS OF 2023

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

This year, according to their Measure of Academic Progress standardized tests, the Ellacuría Class of 2023 graduated 8th grade on average at a 12th grade level in mathematics, and at an 11th grade level in English language usage and reading. The incredible growth our graduating class demonstrated is a major credit to their hard work and Nativity's talented lead teachers and Teaching Fellows who create a rigorous and engaging learning environment that enables all students to thrive and be prepared to excel in high school.



2023 SUMMER OF SERVICE

A core component of the Nativity Worcester experience is its mandatory summer session during the month of July with three weeks of classes, field trips, and a comprehensive service-learning program. The mornings begin with language arts and math classes, which help our students improve and excel in core academic subjects before the traditional school year begins. In the afternoons, students and faculty

volunteer for local organizations related to the topics they are learning about in service-learning classes. The goal of the service-based learning is to engage students in projects that not only teach them valuable, curriculumlinked lessons, but also empower them to recognize the ways they can improve their community. This year, our fifth through seventh grade students volunteered with El Buen Samaritano, Veterans, Inc. and St. John's Church. The eighth grade students had the opportunity to participate in Nativity's

Youth Philanthropy Initiative (YPI) and learn about philanthropy within nonprofit organizations. They reflect on their own personal values to determine which key social issue they deem most important to support in the Worcester community. Based on this determination, the students are given the opportunity to distribute \$5,000 of grant funds to local organizations. The YPI Program and Summer Session are unique and foundational opportunities for our students to develop their leadership and service skills.









THE BOB COUSY ASSIST PROGRAM

In September of 2023, Nativity Worcester was proud to announce a partnership with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Massachusetts, College of the Holy Cross, and NBA Legend Bob Cousy, a longtime supporter of the school and the Worcester community as a whole. Working with these partners, Nativity and Big Brothers Big Sisters have established a mentorship program for students at Nativity, who are paired with a member of the College of the Holy Cross Men's or Women's Basketball Team as their Big Brother or Big Sister. We are so grateful to Bob Cousy, Big Brothers Big Sisters, and Holy Cross for helping to make this program possible! We are excited to see the amazing things our students will accomplish under the guidance of their excellent new role models.

Each year in November, the Graduate Support Program distributes Graduate Care Packages to four classes of Nativity graduates who have transitioned from high school. These packages consist of self care hygienic products, stationary supplies, gift cards, and non-perishable food and snacks. This year's list of graduates who will receive the care packages include the Ricci ('19), Anchieta ('18), Ikunza ('17), and Brooks ('16) classes. Care packages are a heartfelt gesture designed to support and uplift students in whatever journey they are currently on. These packages are put together with the help of our PTA team and filled with handwritten notes from our current students. Many of our graduates are facing a whole new world; sometimes far away from home, with new challenges, obstacles, and opportunities. These care packages are to remind them that we miss them and are thinking about them here at Nativity. We are wishing them luck and thanking them for continuing to be role models for our community!







ENSURING LONG-TERM SUCCESS: THE IMPACT OF THE GRADUATE SUPPORT PROGRAM

Nativity Worcester makes a 12 year commitment to its students, meaning holistic support does not end in 8th grade, but continues for graduates in high school, college and the workforce. The Graduate Support Program effectively tracks, supports, and mentors students once they have graduated from Nativity, ensuring each student's success in high school and access to continuing education opportunities. The Graduate Support Program strives to meet the growing and diverse needs of our graduates as they navigate an often challenging world. We provide a safe and quiet space for homework help or schoolwork, high school transition and completion support, after-school and summer job search assistance, skill-building events, community service opportunities, and college search and financial aid application support. Currently, 307 graduates from nineteen classes are benefiting from the Graduate Support Program

At 20 years, Nativity School of Worcester is undertaking a historic endeavor-the launch of an ambitious \$20 million campaign aimed at establishing a Girls Division, ensuring that young women can receive a transformative education. This bold initiative reflects Nativity Worcester's commitment to expanding access to an excellent education and to growing its impact. Access & Impact: The Campaign for Nativity School of Worcester will establish the first tuition-free private school for girls in Central Massachusetts and create an opportunity that ensures each student thrives and develops into tomorrow's leaders.

On Saturday, October 14, 2023, at Nativity's 20th Anniversary Gala, we publicly launched our Campaign and announced a \$3,000,000 gift from the J.D. Power Family and Kenrose Kitchen Table Foundation in support of the Campaign. In recognition of this incredibly impactful gift, the Girls Division has been named the "Julie Power Girls Division" in honor of Julie Power. James David Power III and his wife, Julie, founded J.D. Power and Associates in 1968, having become one of the most globally recognized marketing research firms today. Julie was a teacher by training and she volunteered her time to teach English as a second language to children who were immigrants.

The one year "quiet phase" of the Campaign that led up to the October Campaign launch raised \$14,000,000 thanks to many generous supporters. Chris Collins, Co-Chair of Nativity Worcester's Campaign Committee, said, "The response to the quiet phase of the campaign has far exceeded our expectations. Donors have consistently pointed to the success of the school over the past 20 years as the motivating factor behind their commitment to help us strengthen Nativity's offerings and most importantly to provide the same opportunities for young women in Worcester. Our long-held dream of opening a Girls' Division is now within sight. We are grateful that both boys and girls from Worcester will now join in the Nativity Worcester promise to educate the whole person." Nativity believes that empowering young women will not only ensure that future Nativity Women reach their full potential but this bold initiative will strengthen our entire school and positively impact the broader community and society.





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
