Admissions Process

1. Admissions Inquiry form

To begin the the Admissions process, go to the Admissions page on the Nativity School of Worcester website and complete and submit the initial inquiry form

2. Attend an Information Session

This 30-45 min session will be a wonderful opportunity for you to learn more about our programs, values and the unique environment we offer.

3. Attend an open house

Our open house offers parents a valuable opportunity to gain a comprehensive understanding of our school's mission and values. Attendees will have the chance to tour the campus, hear from teachers, and observe classroom spaces. Additionally, there will be opportunities to listen to current students, former students, and parents share their personal experiences.

4. Application Form

In addition to the application, parents and guardians must also submit a copy of their last income tax return (Form 1040 or equivalent) on which the student is listed as a dependent

5. Student Record release Form

This form authorizes your child's current school to release: transcripts, IEP's and other relevant educational/ medical documents, including teacher recommendations

6. Family/student interview

Interviews will be scheduled when all of the required student documents are received by Nativity School of Worcester's admissions office from his/her current school. Interviews will be set up by appointment for you and your child to meet two members of the Admissions Committee for a 30-45 minute interview/conversation.

7. Shadow day

Following the student interview, the student applicant will be invited to spend a full day in classes and activities at the school

8. Placement exam

Your child must sit for a placement exam (MAPS testing) on a predetermined date. This exam does not impact an admissions decision, rather it helps us determine how we can best support your child in being a successful learner should he/she be accepted.

9. Admissions committee Decision meeting

The Admissions Committee reviews and makes decisions on all Admissions Applications around the second week of April. You will then receive a text message and an email notifying you of our decision by the end of that week. The current year tax return (2025) must be submitted before a final admissions decision has been made. Should your child be accepted, you will then receive a formal email with next steps.
